

We strongly believe in the power of public and private partnerships. We know from experience that decisions made at a local level by the region's councils, allied with the support provided by the Chamber of Commerce, can have an incredible impact – delivering inclusive growth, helping businesses innovate and grow, creating jobs and building a strong and resilient economy.

Coventry & Warwickshire Chamber of Commerce has delivered a plethora of business support for many years. This report, however, will focus on Business Support programmes delivered since January 2019. These programmes have been part funded by European Regional Development Funds (ERDF) and part funded by our City, County and District and Borough Councils. They have

offered exceptional value for money, encouraging business owners to think strategically, and work on, rather than in, their business. All programmes offer blended support, combining 1:1 support with workshops and masterclasses. Thereby allowing support to be tailored to individual need, facilitating strategic learning and empowering business owners to identify opportunities.

Nothing compares with practical experience; indeed many of the Chamber's Business Advisors have run their own business, giving them real insight into the mindset of business owners. Working diagnostically our Advisors can quickly understand challenges that a business owner faces, and translate into practical, accessible and scalable actions. Business Advisors are able

to demystify grant funding, support business owners to think strategically acting as a catalyst for business development and growth.

The area comprises the towns of Nuneaton and Bedworth, the large village of Bulkington and the green belt land in between. Having been awarded large sums of funding for an exciting regeneration project there are huge levels of optimism for the firms within the region. The area is also home to some of the country's leading manufacturing facilities which have created a highly skilled workforce. We want to work together, build on inward investment opportunities and maximise growth; thereby realising Nuneaton and Bedworth's regeneration ambitions.





START-UP

SUPPORT TO BUILD A NEW BUSINESS DREAM...

The Start Up programme, delivered by the Chamber on behalf of Warwickshire County Council, has successfully delivered support to hundreds of businesses across Warwickshire since 2019. Activities are part funded by the European Regional Development Fund, forming part of the CW Business: Start, Grow and Scale Programme. They are also funded by Warwickshire County Council and all 5 District & Borough

Our experienced Business Advisors understand first-hand the challenges of business start-up. We help individuals who have an idea, and are looking to start, as well as those in their early phase of trading. Individuals can access up to 12 hours of 1:1 support and a range of workshops and masterclasses.

Not for profit, agile and autonomous we are able to respond quickly to funders' and business' needs. We can develop programmes built on tried and tested successful delivery, as well as trial new ways of working to ensure we continue to innovate and remain relevant. Whether participants are looking to sound out ideas, upskill or ask technical questions, our collaborative approach helps increase chances of success.

ACCESS PANEL SHOP

Access Panel Shop in Nuneaton supplies wall and ceiling panels for the construction industry and was started by sisters Lisa and Julie Cartwright, after they'd been made redundant. The support they received from the Chamber was crucial in getting the business off to a good start, establishing a UK-wide network of customers and plan for an e-commerce web site.

The Chamber provided support on behalf of Warwickshire County Council through the CW Business: Start, Grow and

Scale programme, part funded by ERDF, Warwickshire County Council and all five District and Borough Councils, Julie says "It can be daunting launching a new business but Rita has really helped us with our confidence as well as practical advice. From where we were to where we are now is amazing and Rita has helped us more than she will ever know". Julie goes on to say they are now expanding their range to include roof and floor panels, and are also developing a new product.

TREE-V

Nuneaton based, Tree-V was set up to help drivers of petrol and diesel vehicles offset their carbon footprint through tree planting and forest maintenance, with the help of a forestry partner.

The Chamber's Start Up Business Advisor Rita Booth supported the firm as part of the CW Business, Start, Grow and Scale programme, part funded by ERDF, Warwickshire County Council and all five District and Borough Councils. Rita supported Tree-V in identifying the different markets it could tailor its services towards, supported its marketing and branding, as well as helping to structure the business and its processes.

ACCELERATING A PATH TO BUSINESS SUCCESS...

Our Business Growth Programme, Accelerated Growth, has successfully delivered intensive 1:1 support to thousands of **Businesses across Coventry** and Warwickshire since 2019. Coventry & Warwickshire Business Support Programme which is part funded by the European Regional a team of experienced Business Advisors the programme offers 1:1 support, both online, and at Businesses' premises. We work with a wide range of businesses, including those within Engineering and Manufacturing, Food and Drink, Specialist Business and Professional services, information and communication technologies and the Creative sector. Businesses need to demonstrate an appetite for growth, therein they are looking to recruit staff, diversify and/or explore new grant funding.



TRUCK SMART

Sam Neale, owner of Specialist truck washing firm, Truck Smart, in Nuneaton accessed the Chamber's Accelerated Growth Programme back in 2021. The firm, founded in 2010, was initially started as a car valeting service before progressing to cleaning trucks. The Chamber supported Sam, through the Accelerated Growth Programme, part of the Coventry and Warwickshire **Business Support** Programme, which was part funded by the European Regional Development Fund. Not only did Sam receive help and advice on his marketing,



website presence and business planning but also Helena from the Chamber supported the company to win a grant of £25k to help purchase new vans and equipment to carry out new work and expand its fleet cleaning programme. As a result the company was able to expand, create four new jobs and doubled in size over a 12 month period.

Sam said "I genuinely feel blessed and proud to be able to offer people jobs now and grow the business. It's really rewarding when you take on new staff and see your business grow."



A Nuneaton security firm, which was established by two female entrepreneurs, moved to new offices, eight times the size of their first unit, following rapid business growth after seeking advice from Coventry & Warwickshire Chamber of Commerce. Helena was able to offer Sue Yildiz and Gennine Cope of Kopek Security advice and support through the Accelerated Growth Programme, part of the CW Business Support Programme, part funded by the **European Regional Development** Fund. Helena advised the pair to look at their customers' journey and think about how best to market themselves to potential new clients, including a website audit. But her biggest single piece of advice was to get the company to 'think big' in order to grow at a greater pace than they had originally planned.

As a result Kopek now has 50 sub contractors working for the business, as well as being able to introduce three new services. Helena advises a range of businesses across the area on how they can scale-up their growth.

She said: "I am so pleased to see just how much Kopek has grown in such as short space of time. I looked at some of the fundamentals with them around marketing, key performance indicators and making sure they always had their customer journey in mind. But it always came back to the fact that they could think bigger and push themselves to grow much more quickly – and that's exactly what they have done."

TOURISM, LEISURE & HOSPITALITY

After Covid-19 created such a huge challenge in the sector, which was heavily impacted by lockdowns and restrictions, Project Warwickshire was launched in October 2021. Set up by Warwickshire County Council as part of the CW Business: Start, Grow and Scale programme, ppart funded by the European Regional Development Fund and Warwickshire County Council. The programme is delivered by Coventry & Warwickshire Chamber of Commerce and has been supporting small businesses to grow post pandemic through a free recovery and business growth support

programme. The project offers fully funded free business assistance, delivered by our experienced Business Advisors. This takes the form of 1:1 business coaching, providing impartial, confidential support and masterclasses on topics such as:

- social media
- online presence
- marketing and recruitment
- customer confidence
- increasing footfall.



This project is part funded by the European Regional Development Fund, forming part of the "CW Business: Start, Grow and Scale Programme". It is also funded by Warwickshire County Council.

D'MAY ENTERTAINMENT

A family-run company D'May Entertainment in Bedworth which specialises in creating, producing and managing entertainment for a variety of clientele has been supported by the Chamber.

D'May Entertainment's typical customers have included Twycross Zoo, shopping centres, destination farms, weddings, etc.

Like all businesses within this sector it endured a complete shutdown during Covid. As the UK eased out of lockdown in 2021 D'May Entertainment had to rethink it's strategy and completely relaunch the business. They turned to the Chamber, via Project Warwickshire for support.

Project Warwickshire is funded by the European Regional Development Fund and Warwickshire County Council. The support is delivered by Coventry & Warwickshire Chamber of Commerce in collaboration with Shakespeare's England and Northern Warwickshire Tourism. D'May Entertainment were assigned a Business Advisor who supported them on a 1:1 basis with their marketing and sales and their overall relaunch.

The support provided allowed D'May to win a coveted contract with the Birmingham 2022 Commonwealth Games as well as secure a number of contracts with farms and other tourist attractions. The company has since been able to grow and expand and has taken on a new employee.
