We understand Stratford was hard hit by the Coronavirus pandemic, which halted tourism and placed a pause on the bustling hospitality sector within the area. START-UP

SUPPORT TO BUILD A NEW BUSINESS DREAM...

The Start Up programme, delivered by the Chamber on behalf of Warwickshire County Council, has successfully delivered support to hundreds of businesses across Warwickshire since 2019. Activities are part funded by the European Regional Development Fund, forming part of the CW Business: Start, Grow and Scale Programme. They are also funded by Warwickshire County Council and all 5 District & Borough Councils. Our experienced Business Advisors understand first-hand the challenges of business start-up.

We help individuals who have an idea, and are looking to start, as well as those in their early phase of trading. Individuals can access up to 12 hours of 1:1 support and a range of workshops and masterclasses.

Not for profit, agile and autonomous we are able to respond quickly to funders' and business' needs. We can develop programmes built on tried and tested successful delivery, as well as trial new ways of working to ensure we continue to innovate and remain relevant. Whether participants are looking to sound out ideas, upskill or ask technical questions, our collaborative approach helps increase chances of success.

CRMI LTD

CRMi Ltd is an automotive and engineering specialist, buying and sourcing services for companies looking to expand or optimise their manufacturing supply chain. The company launched in September 2020 with support from the Chamber's Start-Up Team, via the CW Business: Start, Grow and Scale Programme.

Business Director, Sam Jeffreys, says: "Working with the Chamber prompted me to try new things to get the business started, giving me an experienced but impartial sounding board for ideas. To begin with I was looking for help with investment, but I got much more. The help, advice and range of support available was crucial to launch the business."



RAMA FOOD AND COOKERY CLUB

Rama Food and Cookery Club is run by Indian cuisine expert, Uttam Rawat. The Stratford based business offers classes teaching people how to make their own Indian food and provides a food delivery service, with dishes attracting rave reviews. Development Chef, Uttam, came up with the idea when on furlough during lockdown. With the support of the Chamber's

Start-Up Support Service, via the CW Business: Start, Grow and Scale programme, funded by the European Regional Development Fund, Warwickshire County Council and all five District and Boroughs Uttam launched the business. Uttam worked with a mentor and attended a variety of workshops, including marketing, Business Planning and Social Media.

He says: "My mentor was there all the time, offering advice, while the online courses were incredibly useful, giving me help when applying for my start-up loan." Uttam added: "Working with the Chamber was a huge help, it provided me with so much information and confidence which was extremely beneficial along the way."

ACCELERATING A PATH TO BUSINESS SUCCESS...

Our Business Growth Programme, Accelerated Growth, has successfully delivered intensive 1:1 support to thousands of Businesses across Coventry and Warwickshire since 2019. This project forms part of the Coventry & Warwickshire Business Support Programme which is part funded by the European Regional Development Fund. Delivered by

a team of experienced Business Advisors the programme offers 1:1 support, both online, and at Businesses' premises. We work with a wide range of businesses, including those within Engineering and Manufacturing, Food and Drink, Specialist Business and Professional services, information and communication technologies and the Creative sector.

Businesses need to demonstrate an appetite for growth, therein they are looking to recruit staff, diversify and/or explore new markets. We support business owners with strategic business planning, financial management, marketing, sales and grant funding.

TESTING TIMES

Stratford based, Testing Times provides numeracy resources and training for schools and adults. Owner Stephanie Madden says: "I wanted my business to have a philanthropic impact on maths education and adult numeracy and cannot thank the Chamber enough for their support. They provided a mentoring service and pointed me towards Coventry University Enterprise, to develop my teaching resources. The impact of our resources has been demonstrated in our trial school, sparking a love of maths in children from 4 upwards through play-based learning, helping to develop metacognitive study skills. I was delighted when a primary school I've been working with achieved 92% expected progress in numeracy SATS (national average in 2022 was 71%)."



ARTEL RUBBER LTD

Alcester-based, Artel Rubber Ltd has been manufacturing silicone hoses and associated products for over 20 years. They supply industries throughout the rail, automotive, defence, marine, agriculture and renewable energies sectors with silicone that has been developed. All products are tested and certified to meet the stringent requirements of each industry. The company received 1:1 support and training under the Accelerated Growth Programme, part funded by ERDF. They received assistance

with their website content, giving them greater reach, better SEO and more enquiries. They were also signposted to other organisations, including an Innovation Programme, Coventry and Warwick University and a specialist Information Technology support programme. All with the aim of helping them grow their business and expand their connections.

TOURISM, LEISURE & HOSPITALITY

After Covid-19 created such a huge challenge in the sector, which was heavily impacted by lockdowns and restrictions, Project Warwickshire was launched in October 2021. Set up by Warwickshire County Council as part of the CW Business: Start, Grow and Scale programme, part funded by the European Regional Development Fund and

Warwickshire County Council. The programme is delivered by Coventry & Warwickshire Chamber of Commerce and has been supporting small businesses to grow post pandemic through a free recovery and business growth support programme. The project offers fully funded free business assistance, delivered by our experienced business Advisors. This takes the form of 1:1 business coaching, providing

impartial, confidential support and masterclasses on topics such as:

- social media
- online presence
- marketing and recruitment
- customer confidence
- increasing footfall.



MARCO: ITALIAN DELICATESSEN

Marco's Italian Deli has been in Stratford town centre since 1991. During lockdown, the deli was limited to a takeaway service, and owners Tony English and his son-in-law Marco, approached the Chamber for help in developing new product lines. Tony was assigned Business Advisor Marie, who went on to help the business to boost its online and social media presence and take advantage of local marketing opportunities to successfully raise its profile. Tony said "The support from Marie and the Chamber has been fantastic and proved really

helpful at a very uncertain time for our business. "Marie really got to know us as a business and this helped us to make informed choices of where to invest in new product lines that were not available from other retailers. Once we'd done that, the Chamber support helped us to grow our customer-base through marketing and growing our online presence."

THE DOUGH HOUSE

The Dough House started life at a kitchen table and, four years later, moved into quaint new premises on Ely Street, Stratford town centre. They offer a range of courses, including pasta making and a Shakespearian cooking experience to individuals, groups and corporate clients. Owner, Fulden Tur received support from Project Warwickshire, helping her to formulate a business plan and successfully apply for a capital grant of almost £15k towards refurbishment costs. She says: "Part of the plan was to look at the corporate market and that is proving to be huge, with some well-known companies bringing teams here to enjoy the experiences. It's an area of the business we can continue to grow."
