#### Economic update

The latest Markit/CIPS <u>UK Manufacturing PMI</u> (Purchasing Managers Index) fell to 55.9 in September from 56.7 in August, although it's still above the neutral 50 mark which separates manufacturing growth from contraction. The Markit/CIPS <u>UK Construction PMI</u> registered a reading of 48.1 in September, down from 51.1 in August. The latest Markit/CIPS <u>UK Services PMI</u> stood at 53.6 in September, up from an 11-month low of 53.2 in August.
